The Chief Electoral Officer (CEO) of Delhi, Dr. Ranbir Singh informed today that to bolster voter awareness about the ongoing SSR campaign among general public and to accelerate enrollment of young voters, Special Camps were organised on 12th and 13th November at all polling stations of Delhi. These camps were organized to provide every possible assistance like searching the name in the voter list, enrolment for Voter ID card, correction in voter ID, deletion of name, etc. to the general public. There are a total of 13,649 polling stations set up across the national capital.

This step towards voter education and facilitation will not only help the electors to get all necessary assistance, but will also give wings to the vision of 'No Voter To Be Left Behind'.

The CEO, Dr. Ranbir Singh said that the primary objective of the Special Summary Revision – 2023 is to include newly eligible and left out voters w.r.t.01.01.2023 i.e. who have completed or will be completing age of 18 years on or before date 01.01.2023. Another objective for the Special Summary Revision-2023 is to give opportunities for correction in electors' particulars and also to invite objections against any wrong inclusion in the Electoral Roll.

A new provision has been made in Special Summary Revision – 2023 as follows. An eligible Citizen, who is going to attain the age of eighteen years on any of the subsequent qualifying dates in the year 2023, that is to say, the 1st April, 2023, the 1st July 2023 or the 1st October, 2023, may also file his or her claim for inclusion of his or her name in the roll, in Form-6, in

advance, starting from 9th November 2022 and his/ her voter card would be issued after the relevant qualifying date, CEO Delhi added.

Draft Rolls are displayed in all polling stations where citizens can check their names in the voter list. More than 13000 Booth Level Officers (BLOs) are interacting with the voters under their jurisdiction and encouraging young voters to enroll themselves in the voter list.

The CEO also emphasized the need to adopt on-line mode of availing electoral services. He advised every citizen to download ECI's VoterHelpline App. Divyang citizens can download the PwD App of ECI. Online application can also be filed on ECI's portal [www.nvsp.in](http://www.nvsp.in). For any queries or assistance, citizens can call the election help line No. 1950 from 9.00 AM to 9.00 PM on all days except national holidays, he added.

Dr Ranbir Singh further informed that, those who are not internet-savvy can file applications off-line by visiting their Polling Station or Voter Center. For more information, citizens can visit [www.ceodelhi.gov.in](http://www.ceodelhi.gov.in) website.

The CEO further said that citizens who already have a voter ID should verify their name in the voter list on VoterHelpline App or by sending SMS (ECI <space> VoterID number) to 1950. If the name is not found they should file Form-6 for registering again.

On this occasion, CEO Delhi exhorted all new (18 year by 1.1.23) and prospective (18 year by 1.10.23) to avail this opportunity to apply for enrollment as voters. He called upon those who already have a Voter ID card to check their name in the voter list and link their Aadhaar number (Form-6B) and mobile number Form-8) with their VoterID. He requested all divyang voters to mark themselves in the voter list in order to easily avail all accessibility facilities during elections.
