Hurry up! Today is the last day to apply for inclusion as a voter during the ongoing Special Summary Revision. Last date is 30th November 2021: Dr. Ranbir Singh, CEO Delhi.

CEO Delhi also appealed to all citizens of Delhi to follow its official social media handles to stay updated on electoral services on a daily basis.

The Chief Electoral Officer (CEO) of Delhi, Dr. Ranbir Singh today urged all left out eligible citizens of Delhi to enrol as a voter at the earliest. The Special Summary Revision (SSR) - 2022 is in its final stage with the last date being tomorrow, 30 November.

Dr. Ranbir Singh said that we are encouraging citizens, especially the youth, to follow the official handles of @ceodelhioffice on Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, and YouTube and share content among their peers. The youth can also significantly boost electoral awareness, particularly through use of social media.

The CEO informed that during the SSR, any person who would be of 18 years or more on or before 01.01.2022 is eligible to enrol as a voter.

Since a large number of young citizens will be first time voters, they are informed that Form-6 must be submitted by all new voters, as well as those who have been excluded from the voting process by 30th November.

All citizens with a voter identity card should check their names using the Voter Helpline app, texting SMS ECI Voter ID to 1950 or SMS EPIC Voter ID to 7738299899, visiting <https://electoralsearch.in>, or calling the 1950 Helpline for further assistance.

CEO Delhi also recommended Divyang residents to download the ECI's PwD app, which is a mobile app. www.nvsp.in also offers online voter registration options in addition to mobile apps. Citizens can contact the election helpline No.1950 for any questions or assistance from 9.00 a.m. to 9.00 p.m. on all days except national holidays.

Those who do not have access to the internet or are not well versed with its working, according to Dr. Ranbir Singh, can file applications in person at Polling Stations, Voter Centres, or Common Service Centres.

Dr. Singh stated that the Special Summary

Revision-2022 has been going on in full swing with the theme of "Chalo Voter Bane Hum" under campaign "Delhi ka Voter Utsav" and the left out citizens must apply by the last date i.e. 30 November to enroll as voters during the ongoing Special Summary Revision.
