PRESS RELEASE

Special Summary Revision(SSR) of Electoral Roll w.r.t. 01.01.2024 as qualifying date complete in the NCT of Delhi.

SSR's objective was to achieve a healthy & error free Electoral Roll by way of inclusion of all eligible voters with special focus on first time voters and deletion of dead and permanently shifted voters.

The final Electoral Roll published today shows a significant increase in the number of young electors in Delhi, demonstrating the commitment of young electors towards the electoral process: P Krishnamurthy;

Enrolment of young electors in the age group of 18-19 age group has increased by 85.8% during the SSR-2024; also 9335 prospective electors have applied for registration;

The gender ratio of electors has risen significantly from 838 last year to 843, indicating greater electoral inclusion of women: Sh. P Krishnamurthy;

The increase in the number of third gender electors also demonstrates the positive result of special efforts made by electoral machinery towards ensuring an inclusive electoral roll;

Intensifying its efforts to strengthen the electoral process in the region, the Chief Electoral Officer (CEO) of Delhi, Sh. P Krishnamurthy today informed that the Special Summary Revision of the Electoral Roll with 01.01.2024 as the qualifying date has been completed in the NCT of Delhi with the final electoral roll being published today. Commenced with the draft electoral roll published on 27.10.2023, the primary objective of the Special Summary Revision - 2024 was to achieve a healthy, error-free and authentic electoral roll.

Special focus was given to enrolment of young voters in the age group 18-19. Total 67,930 young voters added in the electoral rolls of NCT of Delhi

during this SSR which means 26.7% of the total addition of 2,54,470 names added during this SSR, is young voters. Enrolment of young electors in the age group of 18-19 age group has increased by 9.69% as compared to Final roll of last year and by 85.8% during the SSR-2024 only. Prospective Electors, who are going to attain the age of 18 years with respect to the subsequent qualifying dates in the year **2024**, that is to say, the **1st April, 2024, the 1st July 2024 or the 1st October, 2024**, have also filed advance claim for inclusion of their names in the electoral roll which will be considered and decided in the respective quarter of the year with reference to the respective qualifying date. During SSR-2024, **9335 prospective electors** have applied for registration in the electoral rolls of NCT of Delhi.

As per the Special Summary Revision - 2024, the overall number of electors on the final electoral roll released today is 1,47,18,119 including 79,86,572 male, 67,30,371 female, and 1,176 third gender electors. With the efforts made during this SSR, Gender Ratio of the electors has improved by 05 points i.e. from 838 to 843, demonstrating significant progress in efforts towards electoral inclusion of women, said CEO, Delhi. A comparative chart depicting different categories of electors and the change in numbers from last year is given below:

The increase in the number of third gender electors as seen in the aforesaid chart also demonstrates the positive result of special efforts made by electoral machinery towards ensuring an inclusive electoral roll.

Sh. Krishnamurthy further informed that in order to achieve good quality electoral roll, purification of electoral roll is also necessary as addition and deletion of names is a continuous process. Accordingly, cases of permanently shifted/ death/ multiple entries identified during House to House verification, were processed during SSR period as a result of which total 3,97,004 entries from the electoral roll have been deleted which includes 3,07,788 names of permanently shifted electors, 56,773 dead electors and 32,443 multiple entries.

The CEO further said, “during the Special Summary Revision, various SVEEP activities were carried out to raise awareness among prospective voters about the 01.01.2024 qualifying date, such as regular advertisements in print media, attention-grabbing jingles on different FM Radio channels, NukkadNataks in public spaces, Munadi and display of banners in prominent locations to catch hold of general public's attention.”

The CEO advised all Delhi residents to use digital services which are quicker and more effective like the Voter Helpline App and website <https://voters.eci.gov.in>, that allows access to various electoral services using mobile phones and ECI's Saksham App (Divyang) app that digitally enable Divyang citizens to avail electoral services on the most accessible digital environment
