The Chief Electoral Officer, Delhi Dr. Ranbir Singh today addressed the leaders and officers of the Confederation of Indian Industry (CII) in a meeting, seeking their cooperation in raising awareness amongst their employees, industry members and other stakeholders about the upcoming Special Summary Revision (SSR) - 2022 Programme. He urged all Delhi residents over the age of 18 to download the Voter Helpline app, which will allow users to access all Electoral services of the Election Commission of India via their mobile phones. Divyang residents should download the PwD app, which is the ECI's wholly accessible mobile app. During the COVID-19 pandemic, he claimed that online services will be quicker, more efficient, and safer. In addition to the mobile apps, online electoral services are available at www.nvsp.in. Citizens can contact the election helpline No.1950 from 9.00 a.m. to 9.00 p.m. on all days excluding national holidays in case for any information or feedback.

Dr. Ranbir Singh stated that, according to the Election Commission of India's schedule, the Integrated Draft Electoral Roll will be released on November 1, 2021, and claims and objections will be received from November 1, 2021 to November 30, 2021. During this timeframe, eligible voters who have reached the age of 18 on or before January 1, 2022, can fill out Form 6 along with photo address and age proof. Those who are not internet savvy can file applications off line by travelling to Polling Stations or Voter Centers or Common Service Centers. For more information, citizens can visit www.ceodelhi.gov.in. Special camps will be organised on 6th, 7th, 27th and 28th of November to facilitate the process of enrolment of voters at all polling stations of Delhi.

According to the CEO Delhi, the main priorities for the Special Summary Revision-2022, the CEO office campaign “Chalo Voter Bane Hum” are the following:-

1. All citizens should download the Voter Helpline app, and all Divyang citizens should get the ECI's PwD app.
2. All citizens with Voter ID cards should check their names using the Voter Helpline app or by sending SMS ECI SPACE> Voter ID on 1950 or SMS EPIC SPACE> Voter ID to 7738299899, or by searching <https://electoralsearch.in>.
3. All residents should help in deletion of deceased or permanently relocated voters from the Electoral Roll by submitting Form 7.

These initiatives will result in a significant improvement in the Electoral Roll's health, quality, accuracy, and inclusion. CEO, Delhi also requested that all citizens follow the CEO office's social media accounts (@ ceodelhioffice) on Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, and YouTube.

CII assured that the organization will organise meetings, events and other activities to raise voter awareness during the Special Summary Revision-2022 "Chalo Voter Bane Hum" campaign.
